Report from the Chair for the year 2017/18

"This year's Chairmanship has been challenging, but thanks to our excellent Clerk, Elsie, who has helped and supported me every step of the way, we have got through it. I would also like to thank my fellow councillors for the help and support they have given me, and all the time and hard work they have put in for the Parish.

It was with great sadness we lost Ron Jennings this year; Ron was always on hand for local information or to provide well informed comments on local matters, and is very sadly missed. In August last year we had a presentation from Mr James Walley, the new owner of Habberley Golf Club, 25 members of public attended the meeting. An application was submitted to the planners, in January, and we as the parish council were wrongly accused of not informing the local people of the application.

We are still getting fly tipping around the Parish, hopefully with the deployment of the District Council CCTV cameras, the chances of catching them should be getting easier. We have provided Wyre Forest with the Reg number of a flytipper after they dumped a fridge on the common, and I look forward to seeing if anything happens with that information.

I personally feel quite let down by our new district and county councillors in that they have not been as helpful as I had hoped they would be. But we hope this will change in the future if they restart attending our meetings.

I hope our newsletters that Elsie spends time putting together get more of a read this coming year as this is the best way for the local people to see what's going on in the Parish. I wish our new Chairman all the best with the year ahead."

An application lodged in July 2016 to remove a parcel of land at Trimpley Common from the Register of common land has been refused by the Head of Legal and Democratic Services of the County Council. The parcel of land formed part of the curtilage of Crofton Lodge, near to Mount Pool.

Weather

At the time of writing, the clerk has welcomed what seems to be a return, of late, to weather more befitting the seasons. After a cold, snowy winter, we are now basking in long hot summer days. However, just as the cold brought its problems, we have to be careful with the dry sunny conditions. Take the usual personal precautions against sunburn, but also think carefully about having bonfires or barbecues which can easily get out of control, and catch light to dry vegetation. Also discarded litter, especially bottles can start fires. Please have consideration for neighbours, and pets and take care! And our thanks go to the County Council who reacted to our call for attention to be given to the road near to Trimpley crossroads where the tar has been melting in the recent heat. The picture below shows them treating the area with dust and stone to try to reseal the surface.



Report from Parish Paths & Recreational Route Warden

"Our Parish rights of way are in good condition following another quiet year.

We again received a P3 Grant of £500 and our Contractors have carried out summer vegetation clearance wherever needed.

The majority of paths have been inspected by the PP/RR Warden during the year and the footpaths and bridleways are generally clear and accessible. Stiles and gateways have been kept free of overgrowth, and many waymarks have been refreshed.

Again we thank our landowners for clearing fallen trees from across several footpaths and bridlepaths during the past year. Also thanks for repairing cross steps on stiles and improving a flooded ditch crossing.

A broken plank on the bridge by Worralls Grove was quickly repaired by the C/C and they also removed a redundant kissing gate from Trimpley Farm. However we are still waiting for the C/C contractors to install three signposts and reinstate a waymark post.

The Enforcement Officer was called in to investigate an unofficial change to the route of a path by the landowner. A case of intimidation by a landowner was reported and unauthorised vehicles (poachers/hare coursers) were reported using Hollies Lane on at least 3 occasions at night, causing criminal damage to a gate on each occasion.

Discussions were held by the PP Warden with bridlepath users and the adjacent landowner, in relation to a planning application for alterations which would affect the safety of the bridleway exit.

Our application for a P3 Grant of £500 for 2018-19 has been accepted." Cllr. Mrs. C. Gammond—PP&RRW
