Low Habberley Golf Club Site

We were pleased to welcome approximately 50 members of the public attending the August Parish Council meeting held in the Village Hall. Most of the attendance was to express views in the Public Open Forum on the current planning application, 18/0520, for the creation of a family adventure trail at the above site, including alterations to the site access, creation of additional parking areas, provision of a new toilet block, and replacement structures and ancillary development. Full details of the discussions which took place were minuted in the August minutes of the Parish Council, which can be viewed on our website, or by application to the Clerk for sight of the approved minutes, if you are unable to access the internet. At that meeting, the Parish Council were still gathering information, including reports on the suitability of highway approach roads, before submitting their formal comment. Councillors listened to all the concerns expressed by those present, and will take all views into consideration when making comment on the application. At the August meeting, the Clerk advised that, as Planning Officers were still checking structures already on the site, to ascertain whether or not they required planning permission, and reports were still awaited from the highways re approach roads, it was reported that comment would be deferred until the September meeting to ensure all information was to hand. It was understood then that the application would go to the October meeting of the District Council Planning Committee. However, since then, the current situation is that we understand that amendments to the plans have been requested by the Planning Officer from the applicant, and until these are received, it would still be inappropriate for the Parish Council to submit comment, without full facts. It will therefore likely be the November meeting (at the earliest) of the District Council Planning Committee before the application is decided.

Sports Awards

We are pleased to report that a new 'green' cabinet is being installed at the top of Hoarstone Lane to bring improved superfast broadband speed availability to those people in the local area served by the Bewdley exchange.

Highway Grit / Salt Provision

With the prospect of looming wintry weather, your Parish Council work hard to try to ensure that the roadside grit boxes are replenished and ready with supplies to use on **the public highways**. These boxes are placed at strategic points in the parish where there may be treacherous conditions on the adjacent road, and the grit

salt in these boxes is specifically for use on the public road and is to be accessed for spreading on nearby public lanes by those who are aware of nearby highway problems or the lengthsman, for the good of local road users.



It is **not** provided for the public to take away for personal or private use. It is a crime to steal grit from the County Council roadside bins, as well as being antisocial behaviour, and such activity will be reported directly to the police with full details of anyone spotted taking supplies away for personal use.

Please report anyone abusing these supplies to any of the councillors below or directly to the police.

Meetings





Defibrillators

The Parish Council has facilitated, along with grant assistance from District and County Councillors, the provision of three defibrillators in the parish. They are located in Crundalls Lane, at Trimpley Village Hall, and at Trimpley Reservoir. One of the machines was kindly donated by the former Habberley Golf Club Committee. Each machine has instructions for its use, and will be registered with the emergency services.

Winter Weather Precautions

Trees & Hedges—Could owners please check these, particularly adjacent to the roadside, to see if there are potential dangers of falling debris during winter storms. Council have worked in close liaison with the Thomas White charity to have tree surgery undertaken on trees to the rear of houses at Low Habberley. It is owners' responsibility to check trees and hedges bordering their land.

Power Cuts-If owners check trees and hedges, there may be less likelihood of experiencing these during winter months, but if you do, then don't forget to keep your mobile phone handy with battery charged up, and if neighbours are without power too, then report the outage on Tel. No 105. Keep a torch handy (safer than candles), warm clothing and blankets, a batterypowered radio, and a stock of food and drink that does not require electricity to prepare it.

Bad Weather-in the event of snow, please check on local infirm and elderly neighbours, offering help with food supplies or to fetch medication, but only undertake journeys if absolutely necessary. Let's keep everyone safe in the Parish!
