Another Anniversary



It is 25 years since Paul and Wendy Wright took on the reins of organising the running of Trimpley Social Club, and during that time, it has been a welcome focal point in the village, with many social events being organised alongside the Village Hall, besides just the regular Monday On 23rd December, 2019 at the Ladies evening, Paul and Wendy received a wellearned presentation to mark their years of dedication in this respect. They are now planning to take somewhat of a step back from these roles, and we wish them well for the future. We will long hold memories of their efficient, selfless and inclusive approach to all local people and parishioners, and thank them both for keeping this heart of the village thriving and for the personal time and effort spent in years gone by.

This Parish Council reduces Precept for the coming Year + Future Projects

The Parish Council income comes in the form of a precept, which is the Parish Rate shown on your Council Tax Bill each year. For 3 years now, the Parish Council has not increased this Rate on our parishioners, and indeed, this year, we have actually **reduced** the Parish Rate, the part we are responsible for, **by 6.5%**, for a Band D property. The Parish Council has a healthy balance, and this has been achieved by frugal spending, and successful applications for grants on your behalf. Despite increased costs, the Parish Council this year has spent on two solar-powered VA Signs (awaiting erection), carried out maintenance on the benches and noticeboards owned by the Council, planted spring bulbs, and given a grant to Upper Arley School for the benefit of local pupils. We are constantly looking for grant opportunities, and are currently looking at applying for a grant from Severn Trent and would ask parishioners to come forward with ideas, which fit the criteria. **Severn Trent** want ideas for

"Projects that help people to lead a healthier life and gain new skills; Projects that help to create better places to live in and use; and Projects that will help look after our natural environment, give people greater access to that environment or help look after water; and in particular, projects that have a connection to the water cycle - by perhaps creating sustainable drainage, installing grey water recycling or creating water efficient green spaces" Do you have any ideas? A Cautionary Note for 2020

Throughout this year, do not write, accept, or date any legal documents or cheques in the format of dd/mm/20. Always ensure that the year is shown with the **full 4 digits**. This is because the year could be altered or falsified by adding whatever last two digits would be of benefit to the unscrupulous recipient. In other words, do not write any date in this format: e.g. 4th March 20 or 04/03/20 as this could easily be altered. So instead of it being what you intend, i.e. 4th March 2020, it could become 4th March 2026, or 04/03/2026, or even postdating to 4th March 2017. Let's not make it easy for the fraudsters!!



Donations totalled £2560 for LAM Action and as almost everyone was eligible to sign the Gift Aid form the total is worth around £3200 to the charity. 
Mount Pool Work Party

Winter Reminders



Flytipping

We continue to report the numerous incidents of flytipped rubbish that occur all too frequently in our parish, and can get these removed **only** if on County Council land, and not on private land, and we ask people to be vigilant in our efforts to help catch the perpetrators of this vile practice. However, we wonder if people are aware that, if rubbish found dumped can be linked back to an originating household, then it is the *householder* that will be held responsible, and can be prosecuted. It is therefore vitally important that householders ensure that they only employ **reputable waste carrying licence holders** to take their rubbish away. And we can only hope that those who fly-tip are fined with the stiffer penalties recently reported in the news.

New 3 R's - Reuse/Recycle/Reduce

A timely post-Christmas reminder to please practice the new 3 Rs, as above! It is up to us all, in this throw-away society to take action as we can to help slow any possible move towards Climate Change. Please if possible reuse, or recycle responsibly whatever you can, and reduce waste as much as possible, and sensibly, reduce wasting of energy consumption, particularly of fossil fuels. With very little effort, this could not only help the planet, but also your own purse strings too!
