### High speed Internet around the Parish

As residents who live at the Crundalls Lane / Halls Farm Lane know, you have, or will shortly have, high speed internet! However at the other end of the village, which is fed from Upper Arley, we are still on 'snail internet', which is very frustrating and ridiculously slow. This area includes all properties on Trimpley Lane from Shatterford to Eymore Lane, plus properties on Eymore Lane on the way down to the reservoir. We have been in discussion with 'Superfast Worcestershire' and are now putting together a list of people who are interested in getting high speed internet. Residential properties are entitled to a £1500 voucher, so if we get enough people together this will pay for the fibre to be put in from the Arley cabinet. If you are interested in this, and we hope the majority of people will join in to this exciting development, can you please send an E Mail to Chris Jordan at 'chris.jordan.kfpc@gmail.com', including address and mobile number. The next stage will be to get a quote from Openreach, and Superfast Worcestershire, who are going to assist us with this. After use, of course, your private information will be destroyed. It is being used just to get the scheme started. We hope as many of you at the Trimpley end of the parish will join in and register for this so that the campaign we have been fighting, for so many years, to get good internet service for our parishioners can at last come to fruition.

You may not be aware that the parish council is represented on a local charity, which covers the parish area, and is called the Clare, Witnell Blount Charity. Our representative, Sally Collins, has advised:

"The Clare, Witnell Blount charity runs an almshouses community in Franche. A small two-bedroom flat will soon be available for someone in need of affordable housing. Applicants must be able to live independently and be currently resident in Kidderminster or Kidderminster Foreign parishes. # **Dog Controls**

Wyre Forest District Council are proposing to extend laws in relation to dogs in respect to all "land in the administrative area of the Authority to which the public or any section of the public has access". The laws relate to dog fouling, and also to whether the dogs should be on leads, and the number of dogs being walked at any one time. As a large proportion of our parish is used by many people for dog walking and exercise, these regulations should be studied and strictly adhered to. # Keeping Trimpley Reservoir Tidy



The Emily Jordan Foundation, which works with people with learning disabilities, has teamed up with Severn Trent to rid Trimpley Reservoir of litter. The initiative was negotiated by Parish Cllr. Chris Jordan, following discussions and a site meeting held at the Reservoir by the Parish Council following unprecedented numbers of visitors to the site after lockdown restrictions were lifted.

The project will see members of the foundation visiting the popular reservoir regularly to carry out site maintenance such as litter picking, while providing valuable experience to the people it supports.
