

Proposed Development — Habberley Road, Low Habberley

Wyre Forest District Council Local Plan is shortly entering the next phase of its process. The Overview and Scrutiny Committee met recently and considered the latest report and what are referred to as 'main modifications' which the planning inspector has asked WFDC to consider making, in order for the plan to be 'sound'. It is a statutory requirement that these are consulted on. This is a very lengthy and technical document. The Overview and Scrutiny Committee simply noted the proposals and recommended that the Cabinet go out to consultation. There will be a series of face to face drop in sessions in the three towns and rural areas, when the public will be able to review the main modifications and make comment as appropriate. Details of these sessions will be publicised locally in the near future. Please keep your eye on local notices and press to keep yourselves fully informed.

Low Habberley Verge Bollards



With a view to protecting the grass verge at Low Habberley, it was decided to install bollards at this location. The bollards are of а type approved by County Council Highways to collapse in the

event of a road traffic collision, unlike actual wood, which could prove to be fatal. It is hoped that the grass verge will now recover from the persistent parking of vehicles on the highway verge, which in recent years, during winter months had just become a mud patch. Car parking provision is of course available in Habberley Valley Nature Reserve.

Nominated Neighbour Scheme

This is a free scheme to deter cold callers and rogue traders and help vulnerable and elderly people feel safer in their own homes. It is funded by the West Mercia Police and Crime Commissioner reduce help doorstep to crime. Nominated Neighbour uses bright yellow window stickers to show potential house callers that they will only been seen if accompanied by a known and trusted person after their identity has been verified by that person. All it takes is a neighbour, family friend or family member to agree to be nominated and have callers directed to them. The scheme deters scam callers, who will not want their identity to be checked.
