

# Proposed Development — Habberley Road, Low Habberley

Wyre Forest District Council Local Plan has yet to receive final approval, and recently the Parish Council submitted comment on the Main Modifications. The Parish Council remain strongly opposed to this development.

### Queens Platinum Jubilee

# Parish Annual Precept Charge 22/23

This is the time of year that Town and Parish Councils are required to set the precept for the coming financial year. This translates directly into the Parish Rate section levied on your individual Council Tax bill. Through very careful budgeting, and as reported in our Newsletters in previous years, your Parish Council have been able to hold down any increase levied on our parishioners for the Parish Rate, and, indeed, have not increased this Parish Precept amount now for 5 years. Kidderminster Foreign Parish Council has the lowest Parish rate in Wyre Forest District parishes/towns, equating to less than 50p per week per Band D Household. For this, all our Parish Councillors work entirely voluntarily, giving their time freely to try as much as possible to offer support to the limit of the legal powers allowed for Parishes. This year, because of the healthy reserves the Parish has built up, and after much consideration, we intend to reduce the Precept (i.e. the Parish Rate) by 50% in total. Although this is will equate to only a small reduction in your overall Council Tax bill, as the parish rate is such a small percentage of it, it is certainly NOT an increase, and it is a gesture to help stretched personal budgets this year. Your Parish Councillors have taken this decision to help offset some of the costs which have been incurred by households during the pandemic during the past couple of years, along with some assistance towards increasing inflation during the coming year-particularly since fuel costs are set to spiral upwards during the next 12 months.

This will, we hope, do some good for all parishioners, but also is showing some logical restraint in these difficult times.

We hope that parishioners appreciate the reasoning behind this decision, and that in some small way, we may have helped with our parishioners general costs in the coming year.

#### Volunteers

Many thanks to all those parishioners who have recently turned out to help plant bulbs, and pick litter around the village. We are really hopeful of a wonderful display of flowers on local roadsides in the Spring. Many local people regularly give freely of their time, and if just going out for a walk, will often take a spare plastic bag with them to collect randomly discarded litter to dispose of later in a sensible manner. Indeed with the District Council planning to make cuts in this respect, it seems that this may be the only way to keep our parish tidy in the
