Proposed Development — Habberley Road, Low Habberley

Wyre Forest District Council Local Plan has now received the Inspector's report in which it was stated that the Local Plan submitted by Wyre Forest, including this development was, in essence, "sound". Therefore, subject to The District Council considering the Inspector's Report at a full Council meeting on Tuesday 26th April 2022, and if the Council resolves to adopt the Plan by including the Inspector's modifications, then it will become the main document with which future decisions on planning applications will be made, including the outline plan submitted for the development of the field at Low Habberley.

Steve and Jeni, pictured, are your dedicated Bewdley and Rural Safer Neighbourhood officers, operating locally to combat crime. Every 3 months, they ask the Parish Council to nominate 3 priorities for their attention. Currently these are speeding in lanes, particularly in Low Habberley, and general anti-social behaviour. If you see a crime in progress, you can call 999 or, for non-emergencies, you can call 101 or report it on-line on www.westmercia.police.uk/report

We are very much aware that in current economic conditions, incidents of theft and burglaries, particularly from sheds and out-buildings are still prevalent locally. Our local neighbourhood watch—*trimpleywatch*— operated via e-mail, helps to keep us aware of incidents locally, but we are very much dependent upon the public keeping a watchful eye, and reporting anything suspicious. In particular, recently, with the heavy increases in the cost of fuel, we would ask people to ensure they keep oil tanks and gas bottles especially secure, as they could both be targets.

As can be seen from this table, your parish council have *reduced* the parish tax rate by 49% this year. This has been achieved by careful budgeting over many years, and following on from Covid, and difficult these times re increases in the cost of fuel and essentials, we are doing all we can to help local people by passing on the savings we have made. Apart from Rock, we are the only parish to have reduced the Parish following the years previously where we held it at 0% each year.
