Jordan has been honoured with a BEM (British Empire Medal) in recognition of his work in relation to services for people with learning disabilities, where currently over 50 local people are supported every day, helping them with skills development. This is done through 4 projects -Spokes, Twigs, Woodworks and Go Green, which promote skills and self esteem.



Work scheduled to improve biodiversity in Eymore Wood



The owners of Eymore Wood, The Roger & Douglas Turner Charitable Trust, have entered into a 5 year Countryside Stewardship Scheme with Natural England. The aim of the scheme is to encourage biodiversity in the woods using a method called continuous cover. This requires some strategic tree felling in targeted areas of the woods to allow greater sunlight to the forest bed to allow natural regeneration in addition to widening some of the rides and pathways. There is an agreed phased programme of works over the next 5 years but work will start in August 2022 subject to weather and availability of contractors. All work will be clearly signposted when contractors are on site. If walking in the woods, please respect and follow these signs, and as always follow the country code, taking away your own litter, and any dog-dirt bags.
