Proposed Development on land off Habberley Road

Many of you will be aware of the latest situation with the proposed development of land off Habberley Road. This was widely advertised on the front page of the Kidderminster Shuttle this week (as I write this newsletter) which like many of you, I do not receive, but read on-line. We also understand that many neighbouring homes have received a booklet from new developers, Bovis homes, setting out their proposals.

The site has been sold by the last developer, Richborough Estates, after their controversial plan for 124 homes was refused in July 2022 by the District Council, despite being released from the Green Belt in the District's Local Plan.

Bovis are proposing a new 120-home plan, which is due to be submitted shortly, to the planning department at Wyre Forest District Council. When this happens, the Parish Council will be invited to comment, and will do so, but, whatever your views on this matter, we would encourage you all to submit your own comment to the District Council as well (as we urged both in January and July 2019). At the time of writing this newsletter, outline plans are still awaiting verification of submission at the District Planning Office.

Just after the rock cutting in Hoarstone Lane is an open drainage sump which acts as a soakaway and takes water from the underground highways' drains in the lane. Over several years now, the Parish Council have been asking County Highways to dig this out, as it had become blocked and silted up.

Taking the opportunity of a recent road closure, our Parish Chairman, arranged, at short notice, and with the help of local contractors to have this dug out, and the spoil taken away, so that it would once again be effective in taking the water away from highway drainage, making the road safer to use.



Councillors have also contacted the County Council and reported the poor quality of the patching work done by their contractors higher up the lane. This is already starting to break up and hopefully will be rectified in the near future.

Parish Precept for 2023/24

For those of you who are familiar with the components of the Council Tax, you will realise that only a very small proportion of this relates to the Parish Precept—the rate this Parish raises on the electorate for the Parish Council to continue to operate for local representation.

For the second year running, we have cut this by 50%, as compared with the 2021/22 level, being able to do this by careful budgeting in previous years. This follows the 5 years previously where we held it at 0% increase each year. We feel that our remit is to help local parishioners, albeit by only a small amount, in this period of high prices, and high inflation. On a Band C Property this amounts to approximately £11 per annum on your Council Tax. For this, your Parish Councillors work tirelessly in an entirely voluntary capacity to improve life within the parish.

There is a mobile mechanic and mobile paramedics on the route, and also a broom wagon following the last rider ensuring all signage is taken down and that they 'leave no trace' with regard to any litter the participants may have left.
