A Happy (& Safe) New Year

A very Happy New Year to all our readers. The year has certainly started very wet, being lashed by the many storms which have come this way over the last month or so.

As we are now truly in the winter months, here are some top tips to **keep you safe** in inclement weather:

Power Cut—Telephone No. 105

- 1. Check you have a phone available that will work - digital or cordless ones may not work in the event of a power cut.
- 2. Keep a battery/solar charger handy so that you can recharge your phone or tablet and follow updates on social media.
- 3. Keep the above telephone number handy or save it into a mobile phone (105 or 0800 6783 105) to report power cuts and for advice.
- 4. Have things like a torch or lantern ready (it's best not to use candles or paraffin lights), and blankets to keep you warm.
- 5. Protect sensitive electrical equipment such as computers with a surge protector plug.
- 6. Keep a wind-up/ battery/solar radio ready so you can listen to local radio for updates.
- 7. Most of all, would those of us who are more able, please check on the elderly and vulnerable—amongst family and neighbours. Make sure they are warm and safe. Perhaps take them a hot meal, or run any necessary errands-e.g. fetching medicines or groceries during snowy weather.
- 8. However, only make necessary journeys—stay home and keep safe.

Future Services will include on the 14th January a special Service for Plough Sunday - a traditional part of the agricultural year where particular prayers are used to ask for God's blessing for the new farming year.
