130 Years of Kidderminster Foreign & a Community Governance Review

Parish Councils, the first tier of local government, were mostly created by the Local Government Act 1894, and the first meeting of this parish council was held on 31st December 1894 in the Boardroom of the Union Workhouse, and the "Foreign" of Kidderminster then consisted of Trimpley, Habberley, Franche, Puxton, Wribbenhall, Netherton, Blackstone, Sutton, the Lea, Hurcott and Comberton—in other words, much of the land which lay outside of the old Borough of Kidderminster (i.e. the Forain). The Parish Council of Kidderminster Foreign then consisted of 15 councillors, and was based on three wards. In the following 40 years, the Borough of Kidderminster expanded, and engulfed much of what used to be the "forain" - basically the outskirts, and the 'foreign parish' contracted to just the remaining villages of Low Habberley and Trimpley, and the number of Parish Councillors was reduced to 7 in 1934. All of this history can be read about in detail in the article which the Clerk wrote for the Millennium book produced - "Kidderminster Foreign—Portraits of Trimpley and Habberley", edited by Nigel Gilbert.

So the Foreign (corruption of Forain) was essentially identified as the rural area surrounding Kidderminster. Hence its contraction now to the rural villages of Low Habberley and Trimpley, and current councillors have fought to try to retain this rural identity. As such, a recent resolution was passed to request a Community Governance Review to move the Habberley Park development out of this parish and into the area covered by Kidderminster Town. It was felt that the new development was somewhat incongruous with the rural nature of the remainder of the parish, and would create a geographical imbalance of the parish electorate. As such, Wyre Forest District Council are conducting a review with this aim, and so the contraction of the parish continues. Your current parish council will continue to fight against development and extension of urban Kidderminster into the rural village of Low Habberley, as we did in our objections in 2018 against the Local Plan when it first earmarked this field for development, but now also feel that the current development will have far more in common with the nearby town of Kidderminster than its rural neighbour—our parish village of Low Habberley. However, before this happens, a thorough consultation exercise with the electorate of this parish will be organised by Wyre Forest District Council, and due procedure followed. Editor's note—On a personal note, as your editor and Clerk to this Council now for over 30 of those years, I cannot help wondering what those 15 original Parish Councillors would have thought of the greatly reduced area now covered by the "Foreign or Forain", and how much change has been seen since this Parish Council was created on that New Year's Eve 130 years ago. Even then, reading the old archived minutes, they fought against the ever encroaching "urban sprawl", trying to retain the rural surroundings, but to no avail. So perhaps not so much has changed during those 130 years...but I do hope that the very pleasant and rural nature of this parish will continue and survive for many years to come, and that we can maintain the "forain".

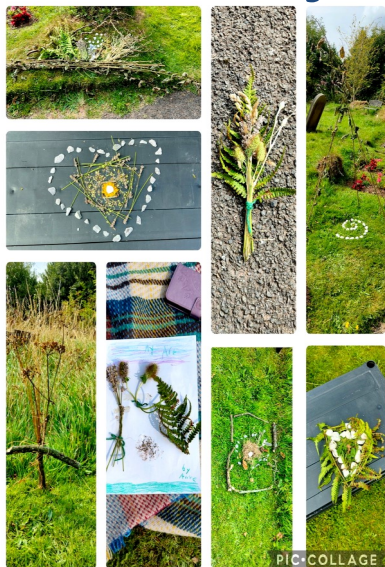

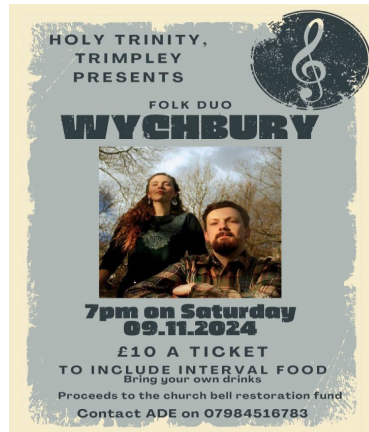

Safety & Notes from the Police

Just a gentle reminder to all that the darker nights are drawing in and people are urged to secure and lock their houses and vehicles whilst unattended.

Also, when the frosty mornings start, people should never leave their vehicle unattended defrosting!

In addition to our local *trimpleywatch*, it is also useful to sign up to **Neighbourhood Matters**. This messaging service / email alert service is updated by members of the Bewdley Neighbourhood Team for residents of the area and gives advice on matters of safety, as well as any crime alerts locally.

Report it

In current times, with many service cut-backs, it seems that communities often have to rely on willing volunteers, or self-help to keep an area a pleasant place to live. However, some problems you may come across locally are beyond the ability of local people to deal with and when it is useful to have services to call upon to deal with some issues, and I list below some contact information for you for some things you may encounter, to report these as necessary.

On the **District Council** website: click on "report it"

- **Flytipping**
- **Dead animals**
- **Issues with trees on WFDC Land (e.g. Habberley Valley)**
- **Street Cleaning and Care (inc. litter offences)**
- **Problems with your refuse bin, or collection**

On the **County Council** website, go to www.worcestershire.gov.uk/council-services/travel-and-highways/report-road-or-path-issue (as it says) to report a road or path issue—including:

- **Gritting routes and issues with Grit Bins**
- **Potholes or damage to road or pavement surface**
- **Issues with Public Rights of Way**
- **Drainage and Flooding**
- **Mud, Oil, and other spillages on the highway**

Although we, as a Parish, along with our Lengthsman, will help whenever we can, your direct public reports in addition to either County or District will reinforce our Parish reports.
