Community Governance Review

On 1st May, all parishioners will have the opportunity to express their opinion concerning a possible boundary change of this civil parish. The question being placed before every voter in the parish is this, with a simple Yes / No reply:

"Should the Habberley Road development be transferred from the parish of Kidderminster Foreign to the town of Kidderminster?"

As previously detailed on our website, and in this newsletter, this would involve moving the parish boundary from the current Habberley Road to the hedgerow adjoining the development, towards the village of Low Habberley. The housing development would then be taken into the area of Kidderminster Town Council. Everyone will have the opportunity to vote to give their opinion on this proposed boundary change. (Please remember to take photo ID to vote!).

Severn Trent works in the Parish



As work in our Parish in connection with the new Chelmarsh -Trimpley pipeline is drawing to a close, your Parish Council are working closely with Severn Trent to ensure that restorative works are undertaken to local areas, to put right any damage which has been an unfortunate consequence of this necessary planned improvement to water supplies in the area.

One of the items which will be included in our discussions will be any road/verge and hedgerow damage caused by the heavy plant and equipment which has been used in the parish area.

For example, we have drawn this road damage to the County Council's attention, which has been caused by the passage of large vehicles in the lanes. We have been in discussion with Severn Trent throughout their project here in the parish, and hope that we will be able to resolve these before their contractors finalise the

works.

We are grateful for recent grant assistance from the District Council which has enabled us to purchase a customised gazebo, to promote the work of the Parish Council. Look for this at local events, and pop along for a chat to see what we do in the parish.

This table shows comparative Parish rates in the Wyre Forest area, which is also detailed on your Council Tax bill. You will note that after many years of keeping the Parish Rate low, Kidderminster Foreign is still the lowest Parish rate in the District. However it will be difficult to maintain this level over coming years, and future increases will be inevitable to cover costs.

However, Wyre Forest's average Parish Rate element in the Council Tax of just £67.48 (Kidderminster Foreign is just £13.30) still falls well below the England Average Parish rate of £85.89 (2024-25).

If you wish to check what the Parish Council rate is spent on, check out our parish website (Finance page) where we will shortly be publishing the end of year accounts, in readiness for the annual AGAR (Annual Governance and Review) (Audit) check.

Speeding & Traffic in local lanes

One of the main issues raised with the Parish Council by local people is their concern with traffic and driving in local lanes. This is why for several years now, we have been urging our local Neighbourhood Policing Team to give priority to this. You may have seen that the Police are monitoring traffic speeds in local lanes, and your Parish Council have been trying to bring about other safety measures—viz:

- VA Speed Monitoring signs (two in Trimpley and two in Low Habberley, to remind motorists of speed limits. Our dedicated Lengthsman, Mr. C. Bunn, checks these regularly to ensure efficient working.
- Improved road Signage, such as the Horse/Rider cautionary sign recently erected in Crundalls Lane; thanks to local County Councillors Ian Hardiman and Dan Morehead for bringing this to fruition.



- We are currently lobbying the County Council to ask if the local bus (297) which serves the villages of Trimpley and Low Habberley could be of a smaller size, (perhaps minibus size) more suited to Parish lanes. This is a difficult request, as it runs between two separate counties, and is a jointly subsidised route, and we do not wish to see this lifeline for some parishioners being axed.
- **Fatal Four**—we are supportive of the recent Police campaign 'Operation Spotlight' to ensure motorists are compliant with rules around **seatbelts**, **drink/drug driving**, **mobile phones and speeding**, to promote safer travel on our roads, and to reduce fatalities.
